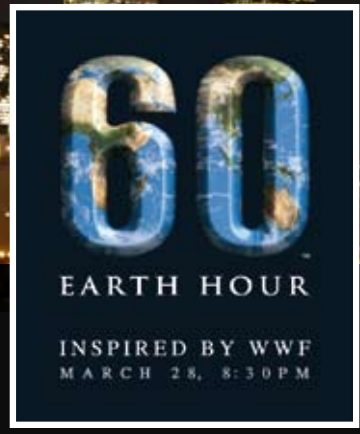




Earth Hour



The Building and Managers Association (BOMA) of Greater Toronto, were proud sponsors of the WWF-Canada's Earth Hour Event on March 28, 2009. Energy conservation and environmental stewardship, however, are integral business practices for BOMA members all year long. Over the past five (5) years those BOMA member buildings shown above, have reduced their electricity consumption by approximately 44,800,000 kilowatt hours (4480 Ontario homes) and shrunk their greenhouse gas emissions by more than 400,000 tonnes (60,700 cars off on Ontario roads). Though BOMA created programs like BOMA BEST (Building Environmental Standards Tool) and the BOMA CDM (Conservation and Demand Management) Program, building owners and managers have been able to identify their conservation opportunities and take positive action to reduce their effect on our environment.

Established in 1917, the Building Owners and Managers Association of the Greater Toronto Area – BOMA Toronto – has grown along with the evolution of the institutional, commercial and industrial building sector. Its territory includes all of Ontario except for the Ottawa Capital Region. BOMA Toronto has grown to over 800 real estate professional members representing 80 per cent of all commercial and industrial real estate companies in the GTA and beyond. BOMA Toronto is also prominent on the national and international stages.
